CERAD'S MISSION AND VISION


The poultry industry is a fast-developing sector which plays a crucial role in global food security. The UK poultry broiler industry contributes to approximately $\pounds 3.6$ billion of the goods and services provided in the country. The poultry sector in China produces around 7 billion broilers and 1.5 billion layers. Sustained growth in both countries is hampered by continued challenges from a large number of avian diseases. Funded by the Biotechnology and Biological Sciences Research Council (BBSRC) and Newton Fund, the Centre of Excellence for Research on Avian Diseases (CERAD) will enable scientists to carry out fundamental and applied research in improving poultry health.

THE MAJOR AIMS OF CERAD ARE TO


- 1. Identify major avian disease challenges to develop joint research strategies to combat losses in both countries
- 2. Develop a platform for research partnerships between UK and Chinese Academic Institutions in avian disease research
- 3. Apply for joint research funding in both countries to strengthen the research base on avian diseases
- 4. Developing future researchers in avian diseases through training of students and post-doctoral fellows
- 5. Build plans for knowledge exchange and commercialisation from the joint research efforts




Na Tang, from Shandong-Binzhou Animal Sciences Academy, presenting her work on technological development of new vaccines at CERAD conference
